Project update - Moseley bend. Worcs County Council and Highways have agreed to install some additional signage at the sharp bend on Moseley Road near Holywards Farm. This will be in the form of a yellow backed chevron board for both directions. This is after much community effort involving residents, our county councillor Scott Richardson Brown, our district councillor Dean Clarke, our parish councillors and our PCSOs at West Mercia Police. Options for a vehicle activated sign (VAS) were ultimately not permitted on this national speed limit road, even though the parish council agreed to purchase a unit and be responsible for maintenance. Vehicle activated signs might only be deployed once it is clear that the problem cannot be remedied by improving fixed signing and once subsequent monitoring suggests no other remedy - hence the current plan.

It is important that residents continue to report all vehicle accidents to the police nonemergency number (101 or via the West Mercia website).
